



ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The IRT seeks applicants who are seriously considering a career as a teacher, counselor, administrator, or professor at the K-12 or university level who meet the following requirements:

- College juniors, seniors, or graduates, including students currently or previously enrolled in a master's degree program
- Those with an undergraduate or master's degree major in the humanities, social sciences, math, education, or computer science
- Undergraduates who have earned a grade point average of 3.0 or above (on a 4.0 scale)
- Graduate students who have earned a grade point average of 3.5 or above (on a 4.0 scale)

APPLICATION MATERIALS

- Online application
- Unofficial transcripts
- Resume/CV
- Three letters of recommendation
- Skype interview

PROGRAM DETAILS

Designed to assist college juniors and seniors, university graduates, and working professionals, the IRT Associate Program provides:

- Personalized and interactive advising in editing statements of purpose, resumes, and writing samples
- 10–12 application fee waivers (an estimated savings of more than \$1,000)

Attention College Juniors and Seniors!

Apply to the IRT Summer Workshop—a paid residential internship on the Phillips Academy campus in July. The workshop provides:

- GRE prep, statement of purpose workshops, and practice interviews
- Exposure to graduate-level curriculum comprising critical, cultural, and educational theory
- Opportunities to develop pedagogical and teaching skills and facilitate seminar discussions while working alongside IRT summer faculty

Upon completion of the four-week workshop, interns *automatically* become members of the IRT Associate Program and eligible for all program benefits.

Come meet more than 60 admissions reps and academic deans at the IRT's private graduate school fair in July! The IRT will help you apply to at least 10 graduate programs.


Approximately 90 percent of IRT participants have received a full tuition waiver and partial or full fellowship funding for up to six years of graduate study.
