### Research classes and orientations in U.S. history, local history and genealogy

The [Milstein Division](#) collects publications documenting American history on the national, state, and local levels, including extensive holdings on New York City history. The Division has renowned genealogical collections that include published and manuscript family histories and genealogy locales, biographical dictionaries, city directories, historical photographs, clippings files, postcards, and other visual ephemera, as well as subscriptions to numerous genealogy, biography, newspaper, and history databases: altogether a vast array of potential teaching aids.

Librarians in the Milstein Division strive to support all researchers, students, and educators - providing essential guidance and connections to collections - via classes, group orientations, and consultations.

### CLASS & GROUP VISITS

We encourage educators, professional and cultural organizations to contact us to arrange customized research orientations, library classes, or to discuss how to incorporate our unique history and genealogy collections into curriculum and class projects. We can host small class visits at the Schwarzman Building, make local visits to schools and universities, or host classes and orientations online.
