The Museum Fellows Program provides an opportunity to gain experience in all areas of the operation of the Louis Armstrong House Museum. Fellows will lead historic house tours, preserve and interpret primary source materials from the extensive Research Collections, participate in membership campaigns, and network with professionals from NYC arts, museum, and archival organizations. Fellows will complete projects with quantifiable results and be exposed to all areas of operation. Throughout the program, Fellows will actively develop their knowledge about Louis Armstrong, jazz, and 20th century history and culture.

The program is open to African-American Studies Majors, History Majors, Art Majors, Music Majors, Library Science Majors, and Humanities Majors currently enrolled at or recently graduated from historically black colleges and universities and other institutions that have an evident interest in the dissemination of African-American heritage. We especially welcome applications from communities that are historically underrepresented in the museum field.
