Texas Studies in Literature and Language is one of the oldest continuously published literary journals in the United States. *TSLL* accepts articles that span all theoretical and critical approaches, historical eras, and genres. Recent special issue topics include Victorian Environments, the future of Jane Austen studies, the films of Wes Anderson, Modernism and Native America, and filmmaker Robert Rodriguez. Whether one's period is early or contemporary, *TSLL* seeks the work of today's up-and-coming scholars, who are shaping and will continue to shape the future of the discipline.

HILFER PRIZE

To recognize the important work graduate students do, *TSLL* annually awards one of its two \$750 Tony Hilfer Prizes for Outstanding Essay to a graduate student. Every essay by a graduate student published in the journal is considered for the prize.

SUBMISSIONS

TSLL invites essays in all areas and eras of literary studies and on American, British, and world literature. We accept submissions on a rolling basis and publish quarterly. Article submissions must be within 8-10,000 words, inclusive of notes and works cited, in the most recent version of Word and in MLA format (9th ed.). Each article will be blind reviewed by experts in the author's field. The editors of *TSLL* are Douglas Bruster and James Cox. Please submit all articles for consideration to TSLL@austin.utexas.edu. Prompt acknowledgment of receipt will be sent to each submitter.
