 <p>WATSON FOUNDATION</p>	<p><b>JK Watson Fellowship</b> The Jean-nette K. Watson Fellowship is a three year, cohort-based program that provides paid summer internships and unprecedented opportunities, including internships aboard, to promising undergraduate students from 12 New York City partner institutions.  <p><b>CRITICAL LANGUAGE SCHOLARSHIP</b></p>	<p><b>Critical Language Scholarship</b> Provides immersive summer programs to learn languages of strategic importance to the United States' national security and economic prosperity. Through intensive language instruction and structured cultural activities, participants receive the equivalent of one year of language study in just eight weeks.</p>

	<p><b><u>The Goldwater Scholarship Program</u></b></p> <p>The Goldwater Scholarship Program, one of the oldest and most prestigious national scholarships in the natural sciences, engineering, and mathematics in the United States, seeks to identify, encourage, and financially support college sophomores and juniors who show exceptional promise of becoming this Nation's next generation of research leaders in these fields.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Sophomores, Juniors  <b>Deadline:</b> January 30<sup>th</sup></p>
	<p><b><u>Udall Scholarship</u></b></p> <p>The Scholarship Program identifies future leaders in conservation or environmental studies; or Tribal public policy and health care fields. The Udall Scholarship provides access to the Udall Alumni Network, the Scholar Orientation and a scholarship for academic expenses.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Sophomores, Juniors  <b>Deadline:</b> March 4<sup>th</sup></p>
	<p><b><u>Truman Scholarship</u></b></p> <p>The Truman Scholarship is meant to celebrate and prepare the nation's next generation of public service leaders. Applicants must be interested in a public service career. Scholars receive up to \$30,000 for graduate school as well as access to extensive Scholar programming, priority admission and financial support from public service graduate programs, advising and mentoring.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Juniors  <b>Deadline:</b> February 3<sup>rd</sup></p>
	<p><b><u>DAAD Rise Germany</u></b></p> <p>RISE stands for Research Internships in Science and Engineering. RISE Germany offers undergraduate students the opportunity to complete a summer research internship at top German universities and research institutions.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Undergraduates</p>

 <p>Public Policy &amp; International Affairs Program</p>	<p><b><u>Public Policy &amp; International Affairs Program</u></b></p> <p>A summer experience that propels rising leaders toward graduate school and beyond. Hosted at one of their Junior Summer Institute sites — top public policy graduate schools at Harvard, Princeton or the University of Michigan, you'll sharpen your analytical edge, expand your policy expertise, and build a powerful network of peers, faculty, and employers.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Juniors  <b>Deadline:</b> November 1st</p>
	<p><b><u>The Beinecke Scholarship</u></b></p> <p>A scholarship program that offers financial assistance and support for the pursuit of PHD programs. Students must plan to enter a research- or creative-focused master's or doctoral program in the arts, humanities, or social sciences.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Juniors  <b>Deadline:</b> February 13<sup>th</sup></p>
 <p>CARNEGIE ENDOWMENT FOR INTERNATIONAL PEACE</p>	<p><b><u>Gaither Junior Fellows Program</u></b></p> <p>Each year, through the James C. Gaither Junior Fellows program, the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace offers approximately 15 one-year fellowships to uniquely qualified graduating seniors and individuals who have graduated during the past academic year. James C. Gaither Junior Fellows work as research assistants to Carnegie's senior scholars.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Seniors  <b>Deadline:</b> January 15<sup>th</sup></p>
	<p><b><u>Boren Awards</u></b></p> <p>Funds study abroad (including internships and similar) by U.S. undergraduate students in world regions critical to U.S. interests. As well as, funds research and language study proposals by U.S. graduate students in world regions critical to U.S. interests.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Undergraduates, Graduate Students  <b>Deadline:</b> late January</p>

	<p><b>New York City Urban Fellows</b></p> <p>Sponsored by the City of New York and administered by the Department of Citywide Administrative Services, New York City Urban Fellows is a nationally recognized and highly competitive, nine-month fellowship program that explores current urban issues through unique learning seminars and first-hand exposure to public sector leaders. Urban Fellows are placed at an array of agencies across the City where they learn about public policy and work closely with leaders engaged in policy and operational work. A stipend is offered to fellows accepted into the program.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Seniors, Recent Grads  <b>Deadline:</b> January 12<sup>th</sup></p>
	<p><b>Columbia SPS CUNY Fellowship</b></p> <p>This program at the Columbia School of Professional Studies aims to provide high-achieving recent CUNY graduates access to Columbia's vast academic, professional, and community resources – includes full tuition and other resources.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Seniors, Recent Grads  <b>Deadline:</b> January 5<sup>th</sup></p>
	<p><b>Princeton in Asia</b></p> <p>Immersive, paid work opportunity at a host organization in Asia. PiA fellowships emphasize cultural immersion and contributing to host communities. They select Fellows who are committed to furthering the PiA mission of fostering mutual appreciation and cross-cultural understanding between the United States and Asia.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Seniors, Recent Grads  <b>Deadline:</b> November 1st</p>
