Amy Jephta is a bilingual Cape Town based playwright, director and columnist who completed her MA in Playwriting at the University of Cape Town. As a playwright, her work has been published in South Africa, performed at the Riksteatern in Stockholm and read at the Bush Theatre in London and at the Royal Court's Jerwood theatre upstairs. Amy currently teaches Afrikaans acting to theatre and performance students at the University of Cape Town, is the conference director for the 2015 Women Playwrights International Conference, and is one of the founding members of PlayRiot, a collective of young South African playwrights.

After two weeks of working with students and faculty, playwright Amy Jephta will speak publicly at The Little Theatre about how emerging theatremakers deal with and shape the history of their country in post-Apartheid South Africa.
