Wat-son Fel-low-ship is a three year, cohort-based pro-gram that pro-vides paid sum-mer intern-ships and unprece-dent-ed oppor-tu-ni-ties, including internships aboard, to promis-ing under-grad-u-ate stu-dents from 12 New York City part-ner insti-tu-tions.</p> <p>Who: Freshmen, Sophomores Internal Deadline: January 6th</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>UK Fulbright Summer Institute</u></p> <p>The Fulbright UK Summer Institutes are three to four week programs for US undergraduate students, who have no or very little travel experience outside North America. Participants can explore the culture, heritage and history of the UK while experiencing higher education at a UK university.</p> <p>Who: Freshmen, Sophomores Deadline: February 3rd</p>
	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>APIA Scholarship</u></p> <p>Scholarships at APIA Scholars are open to AANHPI undergraduate students, must be able to describe ethnicity, heritage, or ancestry in relation to the countries, territories, or lands in Asia or the Pacific Islands. Scholarship amounts range from \$2,500 one-year awards to \$20,000 multi-year awards.</p> <p>Who: Freshmen, Sophomores, Juniors Deadline: January 15th</p>

	<p><u>Jihoon Rim Scholarship</u></p> <p>The Jihoon Rim Foundation will award \$5,000 scholarships to 20 outstanding students of Korean descent for the 2025-2026 academic year. 	<p><u>Udall Scholarship</u></p> <p>The Scholarship Program identifies future leaders in conservation or environmental studies; or Tribal public policy and health care fields. Urban Fellows are placed at an array of agencies across the City where they learn about public policy and work closely with leaders engaged in policy and operational work.
