




This program provides funding for your study abroad experience.  <p>REDUCETARIAN FOUNDATION</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b><u>Reducetarian Fellowship</u></b></p> <p>A unique opportunity for students to begin building the knowledge and skills needed to make a tangible impact on our global food system.  <p>Udall Foundation</p> <p>CIVILITY, INTEGRITY, CONSENSUS</p>	<p><b><u>Udall Scholarship</u></b></p> <p>The Scholarship Program identifies future leaders in conservation or environmental studies; or Tribal public policy and health care fields. The Udall Scholarship provides access to the Udall Alumni Network, the Scholar Orientation and a scholarship for academic expenses.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Sophomores, Juniors</p> <p><b>Deadline:</b> March 5<sup>th</sup></p>
 <p><b>RANGEL</b></p> <p>INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS PROGRAM</p>	<p><b><u>Rangel International Affairs</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Summer Enrichment Program</u></b></p> <p>A six-week summer program designed to provide undergraduate students with a deeper appreciation of current issues and trends in international affairs, a greater understanding of career opportunities in international affairs, and the enhanced knowledge and skills to pursue such careers. Students live at Howard University, attend classes, and participate in a variety of programs with foreign affairs professionals at Howard and at diverse locations around Washington, DC.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Sophomores, Juniors, Seniors</p> <p><b>Deadline:</b> February 5<sup>th</sup></p>
 <p>The<b>Roothbert</b>Fund</p>	<p><b><u>Roothbert Fund</u></b></p> <p>The Roothbert Fund has granted scholarships to over 1,400 Fellows. The Roothbert Fund seeks candidates whose daily actions are guided by spiritual motives. 	<p><b><u>Truman Scholarship</u></b></p> <p>The Truman Scholarship is meant to celebrate and prepare the nation's next generation of public service leaders. Applicants must be interested in a public service career. Scholars receive up to \$30,000 for graduate school as well as access to extensive Scholar programming, priority admission and financial support from public service graduate programs, advising and mentoring.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Juniors</p> <p><b>Deadline:</b> February 4<sup>th</sup></p>
	<p><b><u>The Beinecke Scholarship</u></b></p> <p>A scholarship program that offers financial assistance and support for the pursuit of PHD programs. Students must plan to enter a research- or creative-focused master's or doctoral program in the arts, humanities, or social sciences.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Juniors</p> <p><b>Deadline:</b> February 4<sup>th</sup></p>
	<p><b><u>Jonas E Salk Scholarship - CUNY</u></b></p> <p>The Jonas Salk Scholarships are awarded annually to eight graduates of CUNY senior colleges who have been accepted by, and plan to attend, U.S. medical or graduate schools. The awards are based on academic performance, especially scientific research that the students have conducted as undergraduates. Must apply through the QC pre-med office.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Seniors</p>
	<p><b><u>Earl Warren Legal Scholarship</u></b></p> <p>Earl Warren Scholarships are awarded annually to rising law students whose commitment to racial justice reveal outstanding potential for training as civil rights and public interest attorneys. Eligible law students include those entering their first or second year of full-time legal study at an accredited law school.</p> <p><b>Who:</b> Seniors</p> <p><b>Deadline:</b> May 1<sup>st</sup></p>
