We are currently facing the most polarizing time in recent US history. Many communities are divided along social lines on important issues. Our goal is to support students trying to create positive social change in their communities on those vital issues. Students will submit proposals to work collaboratively to create change in their campus or community. Projects can raise awareness, combat a problem, offer services, provide education and more.

TO APPLY:

Students in groups of 3-4 will submit project proposals and CERRU will choose 3 selected fellow groups. Groups must have an idea that relates to timely issues on campus or in your wider community. **Groups must have 3-4 members submitting a joint completed application.**

FORMAT: Student Fellows will be provided with strategic research and project design to guide and help students to research their social change projects and think about specific needs and budgets. Students will design and implement their projects over the course of the fall and spring semesters. Fellow groups will be provided with ongoing mentorship to complete the program and project funds in the amount of \$500.

How CERRU helps you:

- Workshops on designing and tailoring a project on an issue about which you are passionate
- Financial support for your project
- Guidance through monthly meetings to check in on your progress and help with any concerns
- Provide space and resources to present your project to the QC community
- Provide references and recommendations for employment, scholarships or internships
