





CUNY Summer Faculty Webinar Series: Special Topics in Innovative Pedagogy

The free webinar series with the two special topics, Open Pedagogy and Mindset, are offered to CUNY faculty this summer. The webinars are designed especially for faculty who are interested in these topics, both aiming for greater student motivation and engagement in and outside the classroom.

The 2019 workshops on Open Pedagogy and Mindset were among the most well-attended and well-received events, and this 2020 summer webinar series is expected to fill quickly. We recommend you register for this first-come first-served event early.

Topic 1

Open Pedagogy: Co-Creating the Learning Experience with Students

The two-part workshop, developed and led by BMCC's Open Knowledge team, will introduce the idea of engaging students as knowledge creators through open pedagogy and other asset-based pedagogies. The workshop will model these pedagogies through interactive, small group synchronous activities in Zoom and asynchronous activities on the CUNY Academic Commons. Participants in this workshop will: 1) become familiar with the concept of open pedagogy and asset-based pedagogies; 2) explore examples of how open pedagogy is being used in a variety of disciplines; and 3) develop an open pedagogy assignment for one of their courses.

Topic 2

Mindset: Promoting Mindset-Supportive Practices in Face-to-Face and Online Space

To build on work done at CUNY's first <u>University-wide mindset workshop</u> in 2019, this new two-part workshop led by <u>the University of Virginia's Motivate Lab</u> will delve deeper into the three learning mindsets or Mindset GPS: Growth Mindset, Purpose and Relevance, and Sense of Belonging. Participants in this workshop will: 1) learn the concept of learning mindsets, 2) learn how to apply the concept in various classroom settings; and 3) create their own mindset-supportive plans for face-to-face and/or online classrooms.

Faculty from CUNY's 25 institutions who are interested in these topics are all invited. You have the option of registering for both or one of the topics. However, the space is limited. We recommend you register early.
