Drawing from methodologies of *Theatre of the Oppressed*, this interactive virtual workshop led by Dr. Christina Marín, program director of theatre and film at Phoenix College, will explore several image theatre techniques that are adaptable to both online and in-person environments. Focused on upper body and facial expression, the facilitator will take participants through a series of exercises that can help students dialogue about difficult topics by starting from a place of physical expression and dynamizing our thoughts through sounds, words, and phrases.
