Earl Warren Scholarship - Legal Scholarship

- Who: Seniors
- What: In honor of his memory, the Earl Warren Scholarship is awarded annually to rising law students whose commitment to racial justice reveals outstanding potential for training as civil rights and public interest attorneys. Eligible law students include those entering their first or second year of full-time legal study at an accredited law school. LDF's Earl Warren Scholarship awards are \$15,000 per year for three years (as long as scholars remain in good academic standing and continue to meet the scholarship criteria) for a total of \$45,000.

Carnegie Junior Fellows - Public Policy & International Affairs

- Who: Seniors
- What: The Carnegie Endowment for International Peace is a global network of policy research centers. In a complex, changing, and increasingly contested world, the Carnegie Endowment generates strategic ideas and independent analysis, supports diplomacy, and trains the next generation of international scholar-practitioners to help

countries and institutions take on the most difficult global problems and safeguard peace. The James C. Gaither Junior Fellows Program at the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace is designed to provide a substantive work experience for students who have a serious career interest in the area of international affairs. Approximately 15 students will be hired to work as employees at Carnegie in Washington, DC on a fulltime basis for 10-12 months. Projects range from statecraft and economy, to international affairs, to sustainability.
